Dear Shelley Carter:

Thank you for your letter dated January 30, 2023, regarding the importance of universal school food programs for K-12 students across British Columbia.

We share a common goal to ensure students across BC are properly fed for school success and the understanding that students who are eating nutritious food every day are better prepared to learn and grow.

Ensuring students are receiving nutritious food at school each day is an important part of my mandate letter supported by the Minister of Agriculture and Food to include more locally grown foods in schools. The one-time Student and Family Affordability funding provided to districts was an important first step in government's commitment to make sure students are properly fed for learning.

The last few years has emphasized existing food security inequities for families and highlighted the importance of providing school districts with sustainable resources to create flexible school food programs. The Ministry of Education and Child Care has been working with Ministry of Agriculture and Foods on a provincial approach to sustainable, equitable and community-supported school food programs.

We are pleased that the federal government reiterated their commitment to a national school food policy within their 2021 mandate letters and look forward to collaborative opportunities ahead.
