In this interactive presentation, students will be introduced to lacrosse, Canada's national summer sport and important game. The presenter will bring lacrosse sticks and balls, guiding students through basic handling techniques and introductory terms such as cradle, pass, and goal. Students learn about the cultural significance of lacrosse as a medicine game while actively engaging with the equipment. This hands-on experience offers an introduction to the "Creator's Game" (Downey, 2018), blending physical activity with cultural learning.






