- i) Marcello Gabriel Principal of Hatzic Middle School HMS Renaming of Mascot
 - (1) Wanting to engage in a conversation for SWSW IEAC guidance and support in renaming the Mascot @ HMS
 - (2) Current name is the Crusaders
 - (3) Have removed the Crusader sign in the gym
 - (4) Only the school's graduation photos from previous years have the Crusader logo
 - (5) No other references to Crusader at the school for some time
 - (6) The name should reflect locally in Mission
 - (7) When Hatzic first opened, it was the Hatzic Hornets
 - (8) Looking to include Indigenous history
 - (9) How do we do this in a good way
 - (10) The name Hatzic in Halq'emeylem translates to male genitalia
 - (11) Was told the name Hatzic could remain
 - (12) Just renaming the Mascot, not the school
 - (13) Many animals have special meanings
 - (14) Want to honour Leq'a:mel
 - (15) Would like students to be a part of this, have a voice
 - (16) See what other schools in the district are using
 - (17) Will be money well spent for the changeover
 - (18) Having Marchi connect with the Advisory is part of reconciliation
 - (19) Elders can share the historical aspect
 - (20) Suggested that since there are a lot of coyotes in Hatzic, it should be Coyote since MSS has the Roadrunner 😊
 - (21) Marchi sent an email out to the school community to let everyone know about the change(a) Did not receive any 'pushback'
