a) Mission Public School District is located on the Traditional, Ancestral, Unsurrendered, and Shared territories of Stó:lō people, of Leq'á:mel, Semá:th, Máthxwi, Sq'éwlets and Qwó:ltl'el First Nations, stewards of this land since time immemorial.

Halq'eméylem is the language of this land and of Stó:lō ancestors. The place from where Halq'eméylem (Upriver dialect) originates is Leq'á:mel. The language comes from the land, and it has been this way since time immemorial.

6) Financial Statement Review

- a) SWSW Financial Statement
 - (1) We have been running a bit of a surplus since COVID
 - (2) The projected budget for this year is less than expected (69,000\$ less)
 - (3) At the end of September, once we get our final numbers, it will be adjusted
 - (4) Won't affect staffing
 - (5) School-Based Funds:
 - (a) Every school has either \$100.00 or \$400.00 advance already in their budget, small schools (\$100), medium and large schools (\$400)
 - (6) Library Funds have increased from \$5,000 to \$7,500
 - (a) This is for the work that Jen and Peggy are doing to purchase authentic resources
 - (7) Success Advocates Have a shared budget of \$2,000 to take kids our for a snack or lunch while they are meeting with them
- b) Student Affordability Fund
 - i) Last year we had been given a lump sum from the Ministry
 - (1) We were given \$69,000 and we used it all
 - (2) Vivian asked if we could get more, and then we received another \$5,000 from the Board and we used all of that as well
 - ii) Last year these funds went to a multitude of things (including rent, hydro bills etc)
 - (1) This year we have two sums:
 - (a) Feeding Futures Fund waiting on allotment and info
 - (b) SAFA \$25,000 for everything else this year we will not be providing funds for cell phone bills, rent, hydro bills etc the funds are specific to the needs of students
 - iii) For the past few years, we have had a great relationship with Ravi from the "Steps Together Foundation"
 - (1) We just received 25 laptops in cases donated by them
 - (2) We do have to pay a \$20.00 fee for each of them
 - (3) This \$500.00 will come out of SAFA

7) Information & Updates

- a) Sacred Teaching the'itqel (honesty) & Sásq'ets
 - i) New image from Ovila Mailhot
 - (1) Sásq'ets & Smímeyáth (Sasquatch & Butterfly) the'itqel (Honesty)
 - (2) Ovi wanted to show the gentle nature of the Sasquatch
 - (3) Feel like what you chose as this year's teaching in June, was meant to be
 - ii) Native Northwest has filed a lawsuit against Sasquatch Gifts and Souvenirs for allegedly copying, using, and selling t-shirts featuring a design strikingly close to the work of Coast Salish artist Francis Horne, Sr.
 - iii) We have a new Cultural Day presentation for Sásq'ets & Smímeyáth (Sasquatch & Butterfly) the'itqel (Honesty)
 - (1) A wooden disc with a Sásq'ets waterless tattoo on it
 - (2) It will also have a piece of lacing so that students can wear it
 - (3) For K's, grade 1 & 2
 - (4) Will also include the teaching

 - iii) Equity Plans for this year include:
 - (1) Equity Parent Fall BBQ
 - (a) September 21, 2023, starting at 4:30 p.m. @ Fraserview Learning Centre
 - (b) If you would like to attend, let Marcy know
 - (c) We will be sharing a meal, catered by Valley Caterers on site
 - (d) Then we will come together in the gym for a short Equity presentation and then will ask families what their hopes & dreams are for their students
 - (2) Last April, we brought together students for a Student Equity PATH at Xá:ytem
 - (3) We will be doing this again on October 19^{th} for Grades 7 10
 - (4) Comments shared last year by students were significant
 - (5) We are looking to have one teacher as an Equity Lead from each school to attend monthly meetings
 - (6) In February, will have presentations for non-teaching staff, it's still in the works
 - (7) Thank you, Sonya, for hosting the Equity PATH @ Sq'éwlets
 - (8) Want to do this with Leq'á:mel & Qwó:ltl'el
 - (9) Hoping to be finished this year, but really, it's just the beginning of the Equity work

 - ii) Vice-Principal of Indigenous Education Posting
 - (1) Thank you to CORE Funding and the Board
 - (2) Only have had one applicant so far (external)
 - (3) This could take some time due to staffing shortages

 - (2) This will start at 9:00 a.m. and last until the afternoon
 - (3) Will be setting up a tent on the Soccer Field for the event
