BC Ministry of Education and Early Childhood: their pourquoi of Late French immersion



Upon graduation from the program in Grade 12, should be able to participate easily in French conversations, take post-secondary courses with French as the language of instruction, and accept employment with French as the language of work.

Rationale or purpose of policy

French Immersion programming benefits the cognitive and social development of students, as well as their opportunities for career advancement. Research demonstrates that students who successfully complete a French Immersion program attain functional <u>bilingualism</u> while doing as well as, or better than, their unilingual peers in the content areas of curriculum, including English Language Arts.

The major goal of French Immersion is to provide the opportunity for nonfrancophone students to become bilingual in English and French. Bilingualism is achieved by providing instruction of the basic curriculum entirely in French during the first years. Once a firm base in French has been established, instruction in English language arts is added, and instruction in the English language gradually increases. Students continue to receive instruction in certain subjects in French so that proficiency is achieved in both languages by the end of Grade 12.

Moments of Growth



What does learning during the first year look like?

September to October Focus is on French Language Arts and language acquisition

- Students learn to understand and follow directions in French
- Many activities are done in groups collaborative learning
- Vocabulary is integrated across subject areas
- Focus on phonetics
- The students learn to read basic texts in French



Assessment changes

First reporting period will focus on French Language Arts and your child's growth in Late French Immersion

What does learning during the first year look like?

November to December Students begin to use French to communicate with their teachers and their peers

- Students learn to write simple sentences and to read for information
- Students can answer questions based on their reading and respond to questions and directions in French
- Subject areas are now addressing the Grade 6 learning outcomes

What does learning during the first year look like?

January to June Growth in French

- •Students use French resource materials to do research.
- •Students write increasingly complex sentences and paragraphs.
- •Mostly French is used to communicate in the classroom.

Certification offered to all French learners in Mission études en langue française

What is the DELF/DALF certificate?

- An internationally recognized certification
- Over 65,000 certifications completed in Canada to date
- Assesses French as a second language skills including listening, speaking, reading and writing
- Based on the levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) to which the pedagogy of second language programs in British Columbia is aligned

What can I do as a parent/guardian?

Be	Be interested and involved in your child's schooling
Ask	Ask your child what they are learning and have them explain it to you
Check	Check notebooks and binders and comment on their organization – makes it easier to learn
Check	Check the agenda daily and use it to communicate with teachers
Make	Make sure your child has access and uses French resources (online dictionaries and conjugation sites, etc)
