1) Call to order & Welcome - Viv

5) Financial Statement Review - Viv

- a) Telephone Budget still needs to be amended to show the increase in costs
- b) Funds will also need to be transferred to the Office Supplies as well
- c) **UPDATE** These amendments will be made within the next couple of weeks
- d) Surplus Funds are rolled over as a surplus for the next school year
 - i) We had a surplus last year due to COVID
 - ii) Derek is working on the Budget and we will have a better idea in spring about where we are currently financially
 - iii) Fiscal year is April 1st to March 31st
- e) Would like to see more students receiving Scholarships/Bursaries
 - i) Last year because of the surplus, all students who applied for Scholarships/Bursaries, received something

6) Staffing Update - Viv

- a) Current postings:
 - Indigenous Success Coach for Elementary this is temporary (funding from surplus from 2019-2020 school year); those who have applied are unqualified; would like to consider this as a permanent posting (need to confirm with budget)
 - ii) COVID Funding: Indigenous Liaison Worker for Band Outreach **UPDATE** we have hired someone who previously worked with SWSW in this role, they will start on March 1, 2021.

- iii) CORE Funds: Halq'emeylem Teacher for Middle Schools; currently zero applicants, has been posted since December 2020; currently Brenda Pierre, Indigenous Liaison Worker is working alongside TTOC; we are presently researching the possibility of a Letter of Permission through the Ministry of Education, is a challenging process; Some teachers at Riverside College work from Letters of Permission every year; must be renewed every year; comes with a cost
- b) Halq'emeylem in Elementary Schools:
 - i) In September 2020, we had two ILW's teaching Halq'eméylem at the Elementary Schools
 - ii) One was away on Leave for a few months and one no longer works for SD75; replacement for the past staff member is Brenda Pierre (see above for details); currently we have one ILW working part-time in elementary schools delivering Halq'emeylem instruction
- c) All ILW Postings are posted both internally and externally concurrently
- d) Sharon: Would like more support added for students who live off Reserve

7) Cultural Day Update - Viv

- a) Cultural Days at six elementary schools
- b) All presentations are virtual, except Archery
- c) Grateful for:

- a) Peggy is unable to be here, so Vivian will update on SWSW collaborative projects
- b) Good Medicine Song Project:
 - i) CME Staff working with Elders, Halq'emeylem Speakers, and musicians to learn songs in Halq'emeylem and English
 - ii) Includes Siyamiyateliyot, Eddie Gardner, Chief Johnny Williams
 - iii) Idea is to provide a concert, may be virtual (stay tuned for updates)
- c) Salish Weave Art Exploration
 - i) Donated works of art created by Coast Salish artists; received from a private donor who wanted the prints to be shared for education
 - ii) Prints are in the Siwal Si'wes Library being barcoded before they go out to schools
 - iii) ESR and Hatzic Middle School will be using this artwork in their teaching; sharing their learning journey later in the school year
- d) Stó:lō Sitel Story Revitalization
 - Working with other School Districts and SD75 educators; share experiences of using the stories in the classrooms

- e) Pro-D opportunity
 - i) Dwight Ballantyne presented The Ballantyne Project on the Feb. 12/21 Pro-D
 - ii) Approximately 40 educators attended
 - iii) Hope to bring Dwight back to share his stories (perhaps for Admin, Members of the Board, schools) Vivian is working on options
- f) Grandmother's Lake Story (draining of Sumas Lake)
 - i) Integrated heritage photos with artwork
 - ii) Vivian acquired about 300 copies
 - iii) Siwal Si'wes Library has a class set
 - iv) SWSW staff members have a copy
 - v) Teacher-Librarians have a copy
 - vi) K-6 classroom teachers have a copy
 - vii) Learning Support Teacher and Inclusive Support Teacher in each school have a copy
